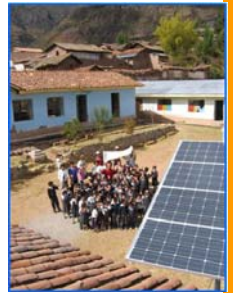

### BoldeReach Previous Recipient Updates

We have an extensive report available on our website with information on all the Clean Water projects funded by BoldeReach and implemented by Engineers Without Borders and Water For People. Here is a small selection of projects:

#### EWB-UC Santa Barbara worked in Araypallpa, Peru, a

community of 260 indigenous subsistence farmers in the Andean highlands. The community has a water source with fecal coliform, a problematic sanitation system and no electricity. Projects included a pilot slow sand filter purifying Araypallpa's particular water source in its particular climate, training the community to perform routine maintenance and water quality testing, solar panel installation, establishing a library in the community to facilitate access to more educational resources, initiation of a grey water recycling pilot project and an assessment for future projects in nearby communities.



#### Manikjore School Water, Sanitation and Health Project



Water For People built two sanitary blocks along with safe water sources for two schools in villages located in the Purba Medinipur District, West Bengal, India. Drinking water facilities were also upgraded at an additional

school in West Bengal.

#### Dakshin & Uttar (India) Water Project

Water For People placed seven deep Tube Wells to provide safe drinking water close by the villages. Women and children now travel no more than 200 meters to fetch drinking water. Prior to this project, women & children walked several hours to sometimes unsafe water sources. Girl children were taken out of school to help their mothers fetch water.



#### El Quiché, Guatemala Lavamanos



Water For People installed eight-faucet lavamanos. These lavamanos, which were constructed in fifteen communities in Guatemala, are used by schoolchildren and teachers for drinking, washing hands, cleaning utensils, and brushing teeth.
